From the Headmaster:

Dear Parents

As we approach the half-term break it is an opportune moment for me to pause for reflection on the many activities that have taken place at Hendon in the past two weeks that paints a picture of the day-to-day life of this dynamic school.

Last week, our pupils in Years 3 & 4, enjoyed a three day residential visit to the Lincolnsfield Centre, Bushey. The aim of the visit was two-fold: to provide our pupils with an invaluable learning experience about the period of the Second World War at this former American Air Station and secondly, to experience a class residential to support their collective personal development. I am delighted to report that the children had a marvellous experience, certainly judging by their ebullience on my visit.

This week our Year 1s have enjoyed a visit from 'Zoo-4-You' who brought their collection of small mammals to school to extended the children's knowledge and understanding of the animal world as part of the Science curriculum. Year 2 have been equally busy learning all about the traditions and myths of Scotland in Humanities and extended their cross-curricular knowledge in Mathematics and Science with baking Scottish short-bread! The final piece of this Celtic journey closed with a visit from the Freshwater Theatre Company with their own version of the story of Katie Morag who lived on the fictional island of Struay.

In complete contrast, our footballers in Years 5 and 6 have been representing the school at the Barnet Football finals in separate competitions for boys and girls. They qualified for their respective

knockout stages by winning their matches in the Barnet Schools South competition earlier this term.

One of my personal high-points from the week was the 'Tea-time' concert on Tuesday afternoon. Our wonderful musicians from Years 2 to 6 performed individual pieces of music on a variety of instruments from the electric guitar and ukulele to the more traditional sounds of the violin and piano. This was warmly received by the audience of family and friends who acknowledged the pleasure to be had from such public performances, no matter the level of talent. I equally enjoyed observing our Reception class constructing a living willow dome with the support of Mrs Platt and Mrs Kezunovic in their outside learning space. It was great to see their sense of achievement from this exciting enterprise as budding future engineers!

I am also pleased to acknowledge the generosity of family and friends of the school who continue to support our House charities by their financial donations. We have had two major charities this week acknowledging our engagement by coming in person to talk to the children about their work: Haven House Children's Hospice and Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital. A big thankyou to parents for all your continued support!

Finally, I would like to thank our school caterers: Thomas Franks, who have been busy this week running nutritional workshops for our children. This excellent initiative is designed to further educate our children in the importance of healthy eating.

• Break Time Snacks:

We are committed to encouraging our pupils to live healthy lifestyles. With this in mind, please ensure that any playtime snacks sent in are fruit or vegetables. Because Senior Prep have their lunchtime later, these pupils may bring in a sandwich with a **nut free** filling if required. Pupils can continue to bring in a small bag of crisps to eat before their after school club if they wish. Pre-Prep are provided with their own reusable water cup in their classrooms. Senior Prep can bring in a reusable water bottle to keep in school. We are trying to discourage the use of plastic non-reusable water bottles.
