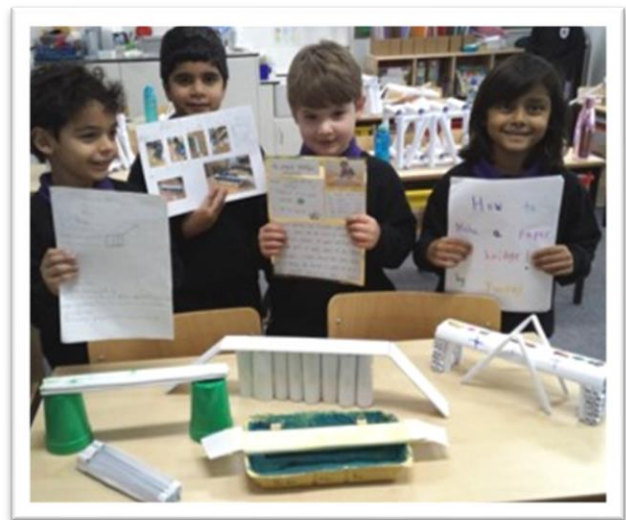
Inclusion Matters
