Express Yourself

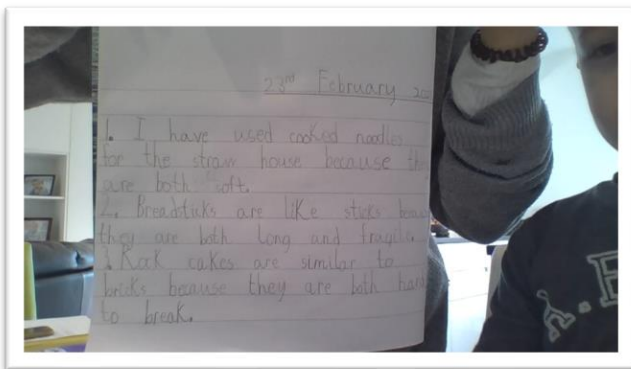

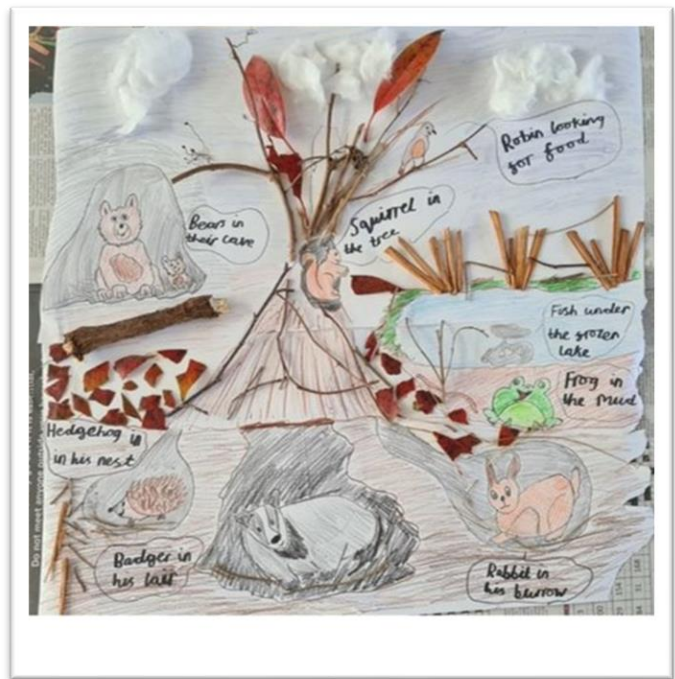


Adapting Habitats
