Headteacher Message

Dear parents, carers and children,

Our children always love to share their learning, particularly when we have visitors to the school. And this week we had a very special visit from the Cognita Executive Global Team, who are visiting a random selection of our 86 worldwide schools. Our Group Global CEO, European CEO and Global Director of Education were so impressed by Hendon Prep: our children and the calm, happy, learning environment. The feedback expressed their gratitude for the warm welcome received, how friendly and engaged our children were and how tangible the caring ethos is throughout our school. Like the children, I am always delighted to showoff our school knowing that at the heart of what makes us so special is the team of outstanding teachers, teaching assistants and non-teaching staff who are committed every day to delivering the very best to each of our children.

This week, I was also able to attend the annual Prep Heads lunch at Habs Boys School, which of course has not been on the calendar since COVID struck. This is one of my favourite off-site trips as some of our ex-Hendon Prep students update me on how they are and show me around the school. It was a delight to catch up with 2 of our alumni who are now in Year 10, as well as to check in with those I taught who are now in Year 13 (Upper 6th). The very clear message from the Habs leadership team was the stress for a move away from tutored students, the importance of encouraging wider interests and the focus on developing character and well-being in our children. Habs have created a bespoke 90-minute assessment for Y7 entry which they hope is 'tutor-proof', comprising verbal, non-verbal reasoning, Maths and English skills, and an interview process which they believe will allow children to show their natural personality and not a rehearsed version.

Working closely and keeping up in contact with our many different Senior Schools and other Headteachers is an important part of my role. I am confident that we are doing a great job in preparing our children for these next steps. Our balance of traditional teaching and learning methods, along with use of Ed Tech and our enriched curriculum at Hendon Prep all supports the development of character and well-being, as well as academic achievement.



Music appreciation

In Year 4, the composer for this half term is Scott Joplin aka 'The King of Ragtime'. Scott Joplin (c. 1868 – April 1, 1917) was an American composer and pianist. Joplin achieved fame for his ragtime compositions. One of his first and most popular pieces, the "Maple Leaf Rag", became ragtime's first and most influential hit. You may also recognise 'The Entertainer', another of his very popular compositions.

Prep pupils have been receiving house points for coming to Mrs Jacob with any interesting facts they have researched on Scott Joplin. Adam in Year 4 even played a piece he has been learning called 'Rag-time Raggles.' Well done to Adam.



Investigating materials
