School News

Half Term Activities

Many families ask about homework during holiday time and at Hendon Prep we offer non-compulsory holiday homework in the Prep school, with a few additional activities for Y1-2. This is because we believe that children should spend their holiday developing other interests as well as developing a love of reading for pleasure. The best support parents can give is to encourage their child to explore the world around them and to engage with them in questioning ideas and expressing opinions. Parents should encourage a love of reading, visit art galleries, museums and exhibitions with their child, do puzzles and crosswords, follow the news together, travel, play sports, have adventures, make inventions out of junk - all things which will foster curiosity and independent thought. Half Term Holiday

Please do notify the School Office if you are intending on going abroad this October half term. While some countries are opening up, others are still following stricter guidelines and all subject to changes. Please do follow any updated government guidance on your return.

Flu Vaccine

At Hendon Prep, we annually hold a session for our students to be flu vaccinated.

Flu is infectious and spreads easily to other people from coughs and sneezes, with flu germs living on hands and surfaces for 24 hours. Children are more likely to spread flu as they stay infectious longer than adults. Vaccinating pupils will not only protect them against flu, but it will also reduce transmission of flu to others and, therefore, protect their family, friends and vulnerable members of the community too. Flu viruses are constantly changing so children need to be vaccinated each year.

All children from 2 to 15 years old (on 31 August 2021), and those children clinically at risk from 2 to 17 years old can receive a free nasal spray flu vaccination. Administering the nasal spray flu vaccine is easy, it's just a squirt up the nose.

Please do contact your GP if you missed the session at school this year or have changed your mind and want to have your child vaccinated.

Celebrating October

Kind Hearts and Hands

Monday 15th November marks the beginning of Anti Bullying Week. The theme for this week is One Kind Word. We talk to our children constantly about being kind. Kindness can break down barriers and brighten the lives of those around us. During Anti-Bully week the children will be taking part in a range of different activities, and we would like to start with getting the children to 'fill our hearts with kindness'.

To do this they will need to draw around their hand, carefully cut it out, write one kind word in the middle and then decorate their hand with bright colours and patterns. Each beautiful handprint will be used to fill a heart shaped display.

Children should bring their handprints to school by **Monday 8th November** and hand them to their form tutor.



Musical mix

In Year 6 Music lessons this week, children have been using an online programme to discover certain combinations of acoustic and electronic drum sounds. Many types of music are created in exactly this way — by mixing and matching small musical ideas to make interesting combinations, and then changing those combinations over time. Pupils experimented by making their own musical patterns by changing the sounds and tempo.



Glass slippers and paper bridges

During their Science lessons this week, 2G have been looking at different types of materials. They have used their research skills to identify various materials and their analytical skills to assess the suitability of different materials for various tasks.

The children all decided that glass wasn't a suitable material to make a slipper, as it would break, shatter or crack. It would be far better to make a slipper out of fabric or leather.
